Associate Degree Nursing Advanced Placement for LPN's

THE PROGRAM:

The Associate of Applied Science degree (AAS) in Nursing provides classroom and clinical experiences to prepare graduates to become exemplary members of the health care team. Graduates of the Associate Degree Nursing program are eligible to take the National Council Licensure Exam for Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN). Registered Nurses provide ongoing patient care and support, promote healthy lifestyles, and coordinate all aspects of patient care in acute and long-term care facilities, as well as other community settings.

Students accepted for college admission may apply for admission to the program and may complete all courses in five sequential semesters. LPN's who meet the criteria for advanced placement may complete the full-time program in three to four sequential semesters.

The curriculum includes general studies, general sciences, and nursing. Non-nursing courses may be completed before entering the first nursing course, if the student chooses. Nursing courses must be completed in sequence within three years of the first course for traditional students and two years for full-time LPN students. If the sequence is interrupted, the student must reapply for admission to the program. A grade of "C" or above is required in all support courses; a grade of "B" or above is required in all ADN courses.

This program allows educational and career mobility for students. In addition to broad career options, graduates may choose to transfer and continue their studies toward a baccalaureate degree in nursing (B.S.N.), or advanced practice nursing (M.S.N.).

ADVANCED PLACEMENT:

In addition to the stated admission criteria, those seeking advanced placement as licensed practical nurses must complete the following:

- **College Placement Test: Submit Accuplacer, ACT, or SAT.** Demonstrate college-ready placement in English & Math
- **Submit Practical Nursing program transcript.**
- **Completion of first year general education classes in the A.D.N. curriculum (grade of "C" or better).**
- **The required transitional nursing course.**
- **Possess a valid LPN license at time of application and admission.**

Students who satisfactorily complete the Washington State Community College Practical Nursing program may be eligible for admission through advanced placement directly after completing the Practical Nursing Program by meeting stated admission criteria.

CAREER SKILLS:

In addition to knowledge gained in nursing courses, graduates of an Associate Degree Nursing program gain valuable career skills for the health care environment. The graduate will demonstrate competence, caring, and critical thinking skills in providing safe, effective nursing care. The graduate will also demonstrate personal behaviors consistent with professional and employer expectations for the registered nurse.

Admission to the Associate Degree Nursing Program is awarded on a selective basis, with preference given to the most qualified candidates. Students must complete all requirements listed in the admissions packet and submit them prior to the deadline outlined in the packet. The Associate Degree Nursing Selection Committee considers the applicant's admission essay, grade point average or GED scores, ACT or SAT composite scores/or submit TEAS score, recommendations, and documentation of successful completion of prerequisites. Submission of **all** admission forms listed in the admission packet are to be **returned to the ADN Program Director in one envelope.**

ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS:

1. Complete application for admission to Washington State Community College.
2. Must be a high school graduate or possess a GED certificate.
3. Submit an official high school transcript or GED Certificate, and official transcripts from any college(s) attended.
4. Complete application form for the Associate Degree Nursing Program w/ admission essay by stated deadline.
5. Complete **BIOL 0955** and **BIOL 095L** (or equivalent) with a grade of "C" or above.
6. Complete **ENGL 1510** (or higher) and **MATH 0955** (or higher) with a grade of "C" or above.
7. Submit **ACT** or **SAT** scores, or submit **TEAS** Entrance Exam scores (ACT of 20 or higher required; or SAT of 950 on verbal and math components or higher; TEAS Exam score of proficient or higher). ACT/SAT/TEAS not required for applicants with a Bachelor's degree.
8. Provide three (3) non-family references.
9. Complete Confidentiality Statement.
10. Complete **CHEM 0955** (or equivalent) with a "C" or above prior to entry into the program.
11. Complete **CHEM 095L** (or equivalent) with a "C" or above prior to entry into the program
12. Complete **BIOL 2310 & 231L** (or equivalent) with a "C" or above prior to entry into the program.
13. *Complete **BIOL 2320 & 232L** (or equivalent) with a "C" or above prior to entry into the program.
14. Complete **PSYC 1010** (or equivalent) with a "C" or above prior to entry into the program.
15. *Complete **PSYC 2700** (or equivalent) with a "C" or above prior to entry into the program.
16. Complete **all** academic prerequisite with a "C" or above prior to entry into the program
17. GPA of 2.5 or higher when applying, and upon program entry.

We ***require*** submission of ***ACT/SAT/or TEAS scores***. As you plan the dates for taking this test, please leave enough time for us to receive your scores before the deadline.

Applicants who submit required placement test results or any other materials received after 12:00 p.m. September 21, 2018 will not be accepted for initial admission to the nursing class. Please be aware that *you are responsible* in making sure *all* required materials are submitted *in one envelope* prior to the deadline *including any transcripts (college or high school)*. *If you are transferring credits from another college, please submit 4-8 weeks prior to the application deadline to allow time for evaluation. If enrolled at Washington State Community College, your transcript printed from Web Advisor must be included. The Selection committee will not review incomplete applications.*

****All admission documents must be returned to the A.D.N. Program Director *in one envelope. No application will be reviewed if packet (envelope) is not complete. All applications will be stamped with time and date when submitted.***

- ___ 1. Submit a completed Washington State Community College Application to the Admissions office. **You must also send a completed application form with your admission packet.**

- ___ 2. Complete pre-admission tests and submit pre-admission test scores:
 - ___ An ACT/SAT/ or TEAS Entrance Exam score. *The selection committee requires an ACT composite score of at least 20, SAT scores of 950 or higher on Verbal & Math Components, or TEAS score of proficient or above. **You may retake the ACT/SAT/or TEAS if desired as long as your scores are received before the application deadline.*** An ACT/SAT/ or TEAS is not needed for applicants with a Bachelor's degree.

- ___ 3. Complete high school level or college level biology with a grade of "C" or above. Your college grade point average (GPA) must be at least 2.5 for consideration as a student in the Associate Degree Nursing Program – Advanced Placement. You must also maintain at least a 2.5 upon program entry

- ___ 4. **Submit to A.D.N. Program Director (all together in one envelope):**

For Applicants Who May Have a Criminal Record...

Sections of the *Ohio Revised Code (O.R.C.)** may prohibit employment of individuals who have been convicted of specific felonies and misdemeanors. These individuals are restricted by Ohio law to provide nursing care to:

1. Older adults in Passport Agencies;
2. Children and older adults in home health settings;
3. Older adults in hospice programs;
4. Older adults in adult day care programs; and
5. Older adults in adult care facilities (nursing homes).

Fingerprinting is required when taking the nursing licensure examination, and is part of a background check when seeking employment in the above agencies. In addition, satisfactory criminal background checks are required by agencies that provide supervised clinical practice while a student nurse.

After completing any nursing program and applying to become a Registered Nurse, each graduate must provide the State Board of Nursing with information about conviction(s) of any felonies, or any felonies or misdemeanors related to violations of any municipal, county, state or federal drug law (including driving while intoxicated), and any crimes involving gross immorality or moral turpitude. After considering the applicant's record, the State Board of Nursing may deny permission to take the licensure examination (or deny licensure) to individuals who have been convicted of certain felonies or misdemeanors. *The Board of Nursing has no statutory authority to advise as to whether an individual will be permitted to take the licensure examination or be able to become licensed until the individual actually applies to the Board for examination.*

Individuals seeking a degree in nursing need to be aware of laws governing application for licensure, standards for professional nursing practice, and employment as a nurse. The Director of the Associate Degree Nursing Program can discuss, in confidence, any individual situation.
